Beginning and ending of the Protocol (or of the last Declaration of Renewal):

The Protocol of Cooperation (Memorandum of Agreement) between the Goa University and Camões, Instituto da Cooperação e da Língua, I.P., was signed on 7th April 2016 and it was implemented in the academic year 2016/2107 (June 2016 to May 2017). Valid for a period of three academic years, it was renewed and signed on 6th September 2019, and it is effective from 1st September 2019 to 31st December 2022.

As result of the amendment to the Protocol of Cooperation renewed in 2019, the Joaquim Heliodoro da Cunha Rivara Chair was integrated into the Directorate of Visiting Research Professors Programme (DVRPP). Therefore, Goa University has designated a new Committee, inclusive of the *leitor* of Camões, who is the coordinator of the J.H. da Cunha Rivara Chair. The courses conducted by the Visiting Professors will be coordinated by the faculty of the Department of Portuguese and Lusophone Studies.
